PINNACLE CNG COMPANY OPENS STATION IN SOUTH LAKE TAHOE

Midland, TX – Pinnacle CNG has opened its newest CNG fueling station in South Lake Tahoe, CA. The state-of-the-art station is located in the main parking lot of the South Lake Tahoe Regional Airport. Similar to its other facilities, this newest Pinnacle station delivers CNG fuel at a rate equivalent to seven gasoline gallons per minute, which is comparable to normal gasoline fueling rates. The station offers public access and will be used to fuel the South Lake Tahoe Regional Planning Agency's Consortium fleet.

The station, which has a weights and measures approved dispenser, uses Visa or MasterCard to complete public and non-fleet sales. This is in line with Pinnacle's goal of making all of its CNG fueling stations Visa/MasterCard capable and weights and measures approved.

As with all of Pinnacle CNG Company's other stations, the South Lake Tahoe site will be monitored 24 hours a day by video cameras and real-time station diagnostic software. Such equipment allows Pinnacle to continually monitor station performance and make adjustments from the company's monitoring centers in Midland, Texas and Salt Lake City, Utah. Station users are able to speak with a remote operator at any time.

"The Tahoe Transportation District is proud to be partnering with Pinnacle CNG Company and doing our part to improve California and Nevada's air quality. More specifically, switching to alternative fuels will help us keep Lake Tahoe clean so that future generations can enjoy this national treasure.
